Addendum

After the monthly meeting of the RCAC, John Violia requested the committee to make a recommendation on the conversation of tennis court number 9 to a multipurpose court. The following was sent to the representatives of each sport with the request that they share it with your members. This announcement was based on the recommendation of the RCAC and Tennis steering committee.

The follow is a message for Racquet Center members from Terry Underkoffler.

The number of people playing racquet sports has jumped significantly this year. We have a heavy demand for the ability to teach, learn and play Pickleball, Platform, Timeless / Spec Tennis and Tennis. We have also seen growth in Junior tennis on all surfaces. This is great news for all our sport. We have one of the top centers in the region and our facilities and quality of instruction in all sports are helping us acquired new members and a high number of guests.

This growth and activity have placed demands on our facility, particularly for our Pickleball. This demand requires us expand the multipurpose use of the hard tennis court number 9. The hard courts are important to the tennis community for winter play and on days when HarTur courts can't be used. This surface is also important for our top tennis players who want to have the challenge of the hard surface. In order to accommodate the needs of both sports it is vital that we share these resources. Therefore, in the coming days we will be relining the hard tennis courts to support multipurpose play. We have researched this, and the top recommendations are: Tennis, by USTA STANDARDS, must be lined in white. For Pickleball lines, it is highly recommended that their lines be a DARKER shade of the color of the court. In our case, our courts are Pacific blue. A darker blue will be used for lines. Please see the attached pictures.

Courts 9 and 10 will be available for both sports on a first come first serve basis. However, we do ask the Pickleball players use the lower dedicated courts first and only use the multipurpose courts if the lower courts are full or if you require lights. Note that most lessons are conducted on court 9 for tennis and court 10 for pickleball.

To continue to grow our sports and benefit the community of players, we must welcome the concept of sharing and encourage people to play all of our sports. Thank you for your support!
